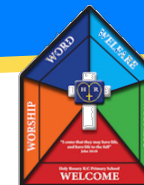

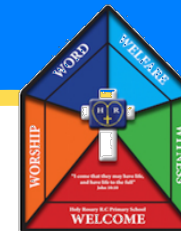

Know that in Islam there are 99 names for God and what some of these names are and tell Muslims about God. Understand that Islam does not allow pictures of God but through stories and his 99 names they get to know God 	<p>Holy Books</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Know that Hinduism does not have one sacred book but several scriptures that are read and studied as part of worship and the context of these books guides their lives Understand that for thousands of years the contents were not written down but were learnt by heart. Explain that the Vedas is the oldest book and is a collection of hymns and prayers, explain how to worship the gods and give advice on life. Explain that the Upanishads is one of the most important books. It is at the end of the Vedas and is a collection of teachings of the gurus and contain the most important of all Hindu teaching. Explain that the Bhagavad-Gita is stories remembered and told by professional story tellers. Understand that every story in the Bhagavad-Gita has many meanings and Hindus find the truth in their stories Explore the story of 'The Bold Beggar', what messages might the Hindus learn from this Explore how the story of the six blind men shows the different ways in which Hindus search for Truth in their stories (Each story may contain a part of the Truth)
